MEMBERSHIP PLAN OF EXAMINATION.

FIRST DAY.

CLINICAL EXAMINATION.

The Candidate will appear in one of the wards of the Royal Infirmary (the number of which will be notified to him previously) at 9.55 o'clock A.M., for the Clinical Examination, which will occupy two hours, from 10 A.M. to 12 NOON; one hour being devoted to a *vivâ voce* and Practical Examination on methods of diagnosis and treatment, and the remainder of the time being allowed for the examination of a medical case.

From the Infirmary the Candidate will proceed to the College, 9 Queen Street, where he will write a full account of the case examined by him at the Infirmary, with a commentary thereon; one hour and a half (from 12.30 P.M. to 2 P.M.) being allowed for this part of the examination.

SECOND DAY.

WRITTEN EXAMINATION.

The Candidate will appear at the College, 9 Queen Street, at 10 A.M., for examination, by written questions, on Medicine and Therapeutics from 10 o'clock A.M. to 1 P.M., and on the Special Subject selected by him (see the Regulations for the Membership) from 2 P.M. to 5 P.M.

THIRD DAY.

PRACTICAL AND ORAL EXAMINATION.

The Candidate will be subjected to a Practical Examination with reference to the Special Subject he has professed, at a place and time to be intimated to him on the first day of examination.

At 4 P.M. the Candidate will appear in the College Hall, 9 Queen Street, for the Oral Examination on Medicine and Therapeutics, and the Special Subject. The Oral Examination will occupy one hour.
