

## REGULATIONS BY THE COUNCIL OF THE ROYAL COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF EXAMINERS FOR THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE COLLEGE.

EXAMINERS shall be paid in proportion to the *time* occupied by Examination, and not as hitherto in proportion to the *number* of Candidates. The time allotted for examining two Candidates shall be one hour and a half.

The fee paid to Examiners for examining for one hour and a half, or part thereof, shall be Two Guineas.

In the event of only one Candidate appearing, the same fee of Two Guineas shall be paid to each Examiner.

In the event of three or four Candidates appearing, two sets of Examiners shall be summoned, and a third set, in the event of five or six appearing.

The fee for preparing each set of four questions for the Written Examination shall be One Guinea.

The fee for conducting the Clinical or the Practical Examination shall be Two Guineas for each day's Examination, it being understood that not more than two Candidates shall be examined in the same ward or laboratory.

The Sub-Librarian, or someone approved of by the President, shall be instructed to superintend the Written Examination on the two days, and shall receive for the two days' service a fee of One Guinea.

In the event of failure to pass the Examination, each Candidate shall forfeit £21.

### ORDER OF EXAMINATION.

The first day's examination shall include the Clinical Examination to be held from 10 A.M. to 12 NOON at the Royal Infirmary. From 12.30 P.M. to 2 P.M., at the Physicians' Hall, the Candidate shall write a commentary on the Clinical Case.

The second day of the Examination shall be set apart for the Written Examination exclusively,—the Written Examination to include Medicine and Therapeutics from 10 A.M. to 1 P.M., and the Special Subject from 2 P.M. to 5 P.M.

The third day shall include a Practical Examination on the Special Subject professed by the Candidate, to be held variously at the Royal Infirmary, Royal Hospital for Sick Children, Royal Edinburgh Asylum, Royal College of Physicians' Laboratory, or other laboratory, etc., according to the nature of the subject, at a time to be intimated.

At 4 P.M. the scrutiny of written papers and the Oral Examination shall take place at the Hall, and immediately thereafter the adjudication as to the result of the whole Examination.

The result of the Examination shall be intimated to the Candidates immediately after the adjudication.
