Sessions will focus on:

- The Acute Receiving Unit - a collection of cases that commonly present on the acute take.
- Diagnostics and Therapeutics - Weight loss drugs, hypertension, the abnormal ECG.
- Same Day Emergency Care - Who can you ambulate? Low risk chest pain and outpatient antimicrobial therapy.
- Medical High Dependency - Diabetic ketoacidosis, Respiratory failure, complex toxicology
- Enhanced Care - Sepsis, Tachyarrhythmias, Status Epilepticus, Community Referrals - Abnormal renal function, Sexual Health.

Acute medicine focusses on the immediate assessment, diagnosis and treatment of medical conditions that require urgent intervention within a tertiary setting. It is a multidisciplinary specialty that involves managing patients across the hospital and requires a broad knowledge of different medical disciplines and quick decision making. This two-day course will explore the 'Blueprint of Acute Medicine.'

2. Improved Clinical Decision-Making in Emergency and On-Call Settings.
3. Increased Competence in Specialised Care Settings.
