- Enhanced Care Sepsis, Tachyarrhythmias, Status Epilepticus, Community Referrals - Abnormal renal function, Sexual Health.


Acute medicine focusses on the immediate assessment, diagnosis and treatment of medical conditions that require urgent intervention within a tertiary setting. It is a multidisciplinary specialty that involves managing patients across the hospital and requires a broad knowledge of different medical disciplines and quick decision making. This two-day course will explore the 'Blueprint of Acute Medicine.'
