

Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh / James Petrie Scholarship

Terms and Conditions

The James Petrie Scholarship provides funding for the recipient to attend the 65th St Andrew's Day Festival Acute Medicine Symposium in Edinburgh, UK in November 2025.

Financial arrangements

The scholarship covers

- Economy class return travel between the recipient's home country and the UK. The funds cannot be used to support travel for any accompanying travellers. Travel arrangements must be made by the scholarship holder in consultation with RCPE.
- Accommodation
- Course fee
- Any visa required it is the recipient's responsibility to arrange the visa.
- Travel insurance
- The funding is non-transferable and must be used for the sole purpose outlined here. No other financial substitution is available.

Eligibility

Applicants must be

- Based and working within any country listed as low or lower middle income by the World Bank.
- Self-funding (i.e. funded by yourself or your family). Applicants who are able to get funding from another source (i.e. an employer, industry or government sponsor, charity or third-party organisation) to enable them to attend the symposium are not self-funding
- A fully qualified medical practitioner



- Able to describe how attendance at the symposium will benefit the delivery of care to patients within their own clinical service and/or country
- Must <u>not</u> have previously been the recipient of this scholarship or the Brian Chapman Scholarship award

Conditions of the award

- The award is made on the understanding that the applicant agrees to accept the Terms and Conditions of the scheme and any amendments issued during the course of the application and symposium.
- Requests for retrospective awards will not be considered.
- The grant is offered on the understanding that the applicant agrees to accept the Terms and Conditions in full and any future amendments to these during 2025.
- The recipient should confirm acceptance of the offer and Terms and Conditions and book appropriate travel insurance on acceptance of the award.
- The recipient should advise the College about any applications for funding from other sources related to this visit or paid during it.
- Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh reserves the right to withdraw the award.
- If the recipient does not travel, RCPE reserve the right to reimbursement for any funds spent unless in exceptional circumstances.

Change of Circumstance

The Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh must be advised of any change in circumstance from that which was originally approved, or which may prevent the recipient from attending the symposium. Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh will then advise accordingly.

Completion Report

The recipient is required to submit a full report of their experience within 2 months of their return.

RCPE reserves the right to request return of funds awarded if the report is not submitted.
