Consultation on the draft SIGN guideline: Cardiac arrhythmias in coronary heart disease Response from the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh

The Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh ("the College") is an independent clinical standard-setting body and professional membership organisation, which aims to improve and maintain the quality of patient care. The College is pleased to respond to this call for views from SIGN on the draft guideline on cardiac arrhythmias in coronary heart disease.

The College is generally supportive of this draft guideline; however we note that in the section on Atrial Fibrillation (AF), there is only one sentence with regard to antithrombotic therapy management, referring to another guideline. Stroke prevention is the cornerstone of AF management (perhaps the most important, given that strokes in AF have major mortality/morbidity) and therefore we suggest more emphasis on the importance of appropriate thromboprophylaxis should be made.
