Royal College of Physicians Committees

The College represents over 13,000 Members and Fellows in 100 countries. The College is governed by Council and a series of topic-specific Committees which range in focus from finance and heritage to strengthening our international links. The Committee structure ensures a wide range of experience and skills are brought into the College's decision-making processes.

Council:

The College's Council is comprised of elected Office Bearers, appointed Office Bearers, directly elected Fellows, representatives from the Trainees and Members' Committee, Lay Committee, and other Faculties and Colleges. Council meets regularly throughout the year to discuss issues of importance to Fellows and Members and set the strategic direction of the College. As Chair of the T&MC has a place on the council and members of T&MC are invited to observe and attend council meetings.

Finance Committee:

Chaired by the Treasurer, this Committee reviews and reports on financial affairs of the College and meets four times each year. Members of this committee include the President, Chief Executive Officer, Finance Manager and Treasurer. The meeting is held at the College.

Education Executive Group:

The Education Executive Group supports the Director of Education in developing and delivering the education strategy. Discussion ensures all strands of education are integrated and that there is appropriate and affordable education available to meet the needs of Fellows, Members and Associates of the College. This group meets four to five times each year.

Equality Diversity and Inclusion Group:

The College is committed to championing equality, diversity and inclusivity (within its workforce and its membership). This group champions the needs of its membership and staff through raising awareness of EDI issues, addressing challenges, and ensuring quality and parity of access, involvement and representation for all. MRCP Diploma Ceremony

Academy Trainee Doctors Group: (ATDG)

The Academy of Medical Royal Colleges (AoMRC) is the coordinating body for the UK and Irelands 23 Medical Royal Colleges. The ATDG includes trainee representatives from each of the Royal College and Faculties across the four nations.

Scottish Academy Trainee Doctor Group: (SATDG)

Comprises trainee doctor representatives from all specialties and junior doctor bodies in Scotland. The SATDG provides trainee input to the work of the Scottish Academy and a coordinated trainee voice on education, training, clinical quality and other matters affecting doctors in Scotland.

Scottish Junior Doctor Group (SJDC)

The SJDC is the BMA Junior Doctors Committee in Scotland. It represents all doctors in training grades in hospital and public health medicine practice in Scotland.

GMC:

Doctors in Training Roundtable is hosted by the GMC Chief Executive Officer Charlie Massey. Issues discussed include the recently launched Wellbeing report by Prof West and Dame Coia.

GMC Regulated Credentials are a new process of formally recognising a doctor's expertise in a specific area of practice where they will help reduce risks to patients and support the service to provide better patient care.

Joint Royal Colleges of Physicians Training Board (JRCPTB)

JRCPTB is the board which works with The Royal College of Physicians of London, Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh and the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow to set and maintain standards in the physician training. This is achieved through curriculum design and implementation, and the recruitment and certification of trainees and supporting the GMC in quality management.

MAP Board

MAP Board is important to the working of JRCPTB, and some of the key responsibilities include:

- Providing leadership for JRCPTB clinical, academic, quality, international and policy activities.
- Ensuring effective governance, management and delivery of JRCPTB boards and committees
- Informing Federation Board, via SLT, of key strategic and high-level operational issues concerning JRCPTB, sharing key information and reporting on issues.

IMT Recruitment Subgroup

CDC Curriculum Development Committee
