RONALD WILLIAM FEARNLEY CAMPBELL

Dr R.W.F. Campbell died on 13 June 1998. He was born on 11 October 1946 in Stirling and trained in medicine at the University of Edinburgh where he graduated MB ChB in 1969. His first cardiology post was at Edinburgh Royal Infirmary. In 1986 he was appointed the British Heart Foundation Professor of Clinical Cardiology at the Freeman Hospital, Newcastle. Dr Campbell became a President of the British Cardiac Society in 1997. He was elected to the Fellowship of the RCPE in 1981.

ALASTAIR WILLIAM BEGBIE CUNNINGHAM

Dr A.W.B. Cunningham died on 2 April 1998. He was born on 29 August 1922 and graduated MB at the University of Edinburgh in 1944. From 1944 until 1947 he served with the RAMC in Italy and North Africa. After working in Edinburgh for several years as a lecturer in pathology, he emigrated to America where he was appointed professor of pathology at several American universities. He became a Fellow in 1965.

JAMES WATSON FARQUHAR

Prof J.W. Farquhar died on 16 June 1998. He was born on 1 September 1922 in Edinburgh and graduated MB ChB at Edinburgh University in 1944. He then served for three years as Medical Officer to the Royal Ulster Rifles in the East. After paediatric training he became senior lecturer in the Department of Child Life and Health and then consultant paediatrician at the Royal Hospital for Sick Children and the Simpson Memorial Maternity Pavillion in Edinburgh. Dr Farquhar had a particular interest in diabetes and endocrinology. He became a Fellow in 1957.

HARRY VARIOT LANGWILL FINLAY

Dr H.V.L. Finlay died on 7 May 1998. He was born on 28 September 1918 and graduated MB ChB at Edinburgh University in 1940. After gaining the MD in 1942 he worked in paediatrics in England. He was appointed a consultant paediatrician at Hillingdon Hospital, Middlesex in 1948. Dr Finlay was elected to the Fellowship in 1957.

NORMAN ARTHUR HOOD

Dr N.A. Hood died on 16 April 1998. He graduated MB ChB at the University of Glasgow in 1971 and was appointed a consultant physician in geriatric medicine in the South Lothian Geriatric Service in 1977. He was elected a Fellow in 1985.

AMIYA PADA MUKHERJEE

Dr A.P. Mukherjee died on 1 May 1998. He was born on 25 March 1935 in India and graduated MB BS at the University of Calcutta in 1957. He became a consultant physician at Durham and later a member of the British Medical Association. Dr Mukherjee's specialty was renal medicine. He was elected to the Fellowship in 1985.
